They took on parental duties and strengthen religious beliefs and wrote letters home since there were many soldiers that couldn't read or write. Imagine being so far away from home in the heat of a Pennsylvania summer with little food and water. Around 50,000 men died and thousands of horses. But in this time also

there were many thousands of conversions to Christianity. North and south. Our guide said numerous times" there were no atheist on the battlefield." We had over 23 riders that took the tour which was 4 hours long.

We came back to a sermon and music from Chaplain Brad Rinehart. Brad gave a great message of hope. Dinner was catered and 30 were fed. After dinner we had a continued message from Brad and Chaplain Steve Sellars. Steve gave a heartfelt message as to the involvement in his ministry of young people in the educational field. We had music and testimony from the different Chaplains. The Lord is sure enough moving in a powerful way. We sang and fellowship well into the evening.

Sunday morning, we had coffee and donuts. A truly personal and blessed Sermon by our exuberant and tireless leader Dr. Dave Harvev.

Chaplain Joel finished out the weekend with a message of hope and encouragement.

The weekend started off on a date we all will never forget; 911. Our country has been under attack from the very beginning and most notably because of our walk with Christ. We were encouraged that even in the death and carnage of the civil war, men sang praises to God, many wounded men; scared, hungry and sick from dirty water and

lack of food. Most had injuries that would debilitate the best, but they sang, and they praised God. They had Church. They had come to a place where they realized they had no control of their next breath; let alone their next day. They had come to a complete acknowledgement of God and His presence. Maybe just maybe, the soldiers that perished didn't really die at all; they are free Indeed.

I first met Joe when he was teaching a leather class. I worked with saddles and was interested in becoming more knowledgeable in carving. Having this common interest and that he had also been a Boy Scout leader, which I admired, created a friendship. I had always wanted to be a Boy Scout and now I was with a man who had all the knowledge.

As time progressed, I also became friends with his family. His wife was a regular volunteer at a local nursing home which was looking for someone or a group to represent a Protestant church once a month. She asked if I could find someone. I tried, but finally had to ask some of my friends to help and we fulfilled that opportunity. Many years later we were filling it right up to this pandemic.

Now I have given you some background as to how mine and Joe's lives touched. What I did not tell you was that Joe did not know the Lord. He was getting up in age and his health was beginning to fail. He had a problem with alcohol. One day his wife called me to come and help pick him up in the large backyard where he had fallen. I did and we sat in the kitchen and talked over a cup of coffee. I told him I had prayed to God for strength to carry him across the yard and into the kitchen.

We became good friends and I learned a lot in my leather work and how to be a great Boy Scout leader. My business and the fact we lived near each other allowed me free time to visit. It also allowed me time as I needed it to lift Joe as he fell more often and needed help. We began to have times together just to share. We were both patriots and love for our country came up often. At every opportunity I would try to mention a Christian idea, God and Country. On more than one occasion Joe said to me "Now Bill, I love you for all you do for me, but when it comes to this "God Thing" we split the road."

One day his wife called and said it was another of those falls. She told me of his breakfast of orange juice which had a touch of Vodka, explaining many of the falls. Didn't matter to me the reason, I just loved the man so I went to help him. On this day I picked him up from behind his back and my arms locked around his body. He was in front of me facing forward. His mouth was spewing curses and he was really blasting God. I stood holding him in my arms and said, "Joe, God told me I have to love you, care for you, but I don't have to like you. If you curse God one more time, I'm not only going to drop you, I am going to stomp you!" You can't imagine how quiet he became. I continued to keep up with him and knew he was rapidly declining.

Well, before long, Joe was put in a nursing home. I visited him regularly as his health quickly deteriorated. I talked to Joe often about the Lord and asked him to pray with me. He would always say no to praying the sinner's prayer. He would be loud and all the staff knew what was happening and what would be the outcome of my visits. Joe

began to need help to go to the bathroom and to eat and was just becoming more and more dependent on care. I kept pressing him to make things right with God. It just never happened. He refused and it saddened me to know he was headed for Hell.

On Monday, I had to go to New Orleans for a two-day meeting. On my way I stopped by to visit Joe to tell him I would be gone until Wednesday. His condition was so bad I told him I was afraid he would not make it and I wanted to pray with him and get things right with God. He loudly went through the rejection I had heard so many times and members of the staff had heard as well.

Tuesday morning about noon, Joe's son called to tell me his father had died around 2:30 AM. Joe had called for assistance to the bathroom and back to his bed. Before he got in the bed, Joe prayed the sinner's prayer, climbed back in bed and died.



The year was 1998, I was married, and my wife was pregnant with our only child. I'd like to say I was a functional alcoholic but the more I think about it the more I see how far from the truth that was. In fact, about the only thing functional was that I hadn't loss my job that at that time I had for 12 years. My wife and I were living with her mother while we had a house built, with us cramping her lifestyle, the pregnancy and my drinking the tension was over whelming. I never drank for the taste, I drank for the effect, I drank for the escape I found alcohol provided. Not only could I seemingly escape the reality of the day but of the past and feel sorry for myself for all the wrongs I felt had been done to me. My wife and mother-in-law had had enough of my behavior and I was given an ultimatum; clean up my act, quit drinking or get out. The next evening I stepped through the door of my first A.A. meeting, it was by far one of the scariest things I had ever done but the truth is I was more afraid of being divorced and becoming a part time father of my daughter who had been born a month and a half earlier.

After a week of going to meetings nightly I decided these people had something I wanted, while we were all different in so many ways we shared a common problem and in all earnestness we wanted to be better.

There are 12 steps to recovery in A.A., which are suggested to be done in order. The first step is to admit we were powerless over alcohol-that our lives had become unmanageable. The second step is to come to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity. The third step which I will always be so grateful for; make a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood him. I continued to work the other steps while going to meetings nightly, I even became a chairperson for nearly two years, running the meetings on Monday nights which

happened to be birthday night where we celebrated different lengths of sobriety.


I had thought that I had been baptized as a child but when I asked my mother about it she informed me that I had not been. Along with my A.A. meetings I was also going to Christians in Recovery meetings and had started going back to church each Sunday. It wasn't too long and I ended up serving on the Vestry of my church, which was a two-year term. I became close with my priest and asked about being baptized and we made plans for my daughter and I to be baptized at the same time. I remember being so happy and proud to have done this especially with my baby girl.

I had been sober for 3 years going to meetings and church regularly when my wife informed me the night after Christmas that she wanted a divorce. I thought I had done so good, people were even mentioning how they noticed positive changes in my demeanor, my attitude and personality. Nevertheless, I was asked to leave and started the New Year looking for a place I could afford and it seemed that I was completely alone. I had always thought I had big problems while drinking and these problems were what gave me the right to drink to excess, I was about to find out what sadness and problems really were and now tested to endure them soberly. Yes, I continued going to meetings, even more so now and kept going to church and praying more and more for help and guidance, I even enlisted my Priest as my personal therapist to which I still feel indebted to this day. Our divorce took a year to the day to become final because of custody battles and during this time my father died. Everything seemed to be falling down on me. Suicide crossed my mind and if it hadn't been for my early religious foundation as a kid I probably would have done it but I knew if I did I wouldn't ever see my loved ones again, not just here on earth but wouldn't be allowed to see them in Heaven either; I would be damned for eternity. I remember many nights of reading my bible and doing all I could to stay close to Jesus until he would ease my mind and let me drift off to sleep. I also remember so many prayers asking to be relieved of my pain and misery and I didn't care how that relief came. The days went by which turned to years and

I remember the riots in Baltimore city not many years ago. I remember. But it was stopped and by 200 clergy. All different colors, all different religions, all different walks of life. They got together and hand in hand marched through the city. The violee stopped.

This world is always going to have differences. Different beliefs. Different ways to worship. Some don't believe or worship at all. But what is the same now as it was then is that there is one God, Who lives in our hearts, in our souls. And how we will come together is in the power of the Holy Spirit that dwells in all of us. What we thought different...was in reality...the same.

I love the men's Bible studies that I go to throughout the week; 5 different groups. I attend many different churches in the area. I preach all over the place. What the world tries to tell us about ourselves is that we are different. No. I can tell you we are exactly the same.

The following verses after 15. Col. 3:16-17 "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns and songs from the Spirit singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. That is where I developed the habit of drinking and drugging, and have bottled these addictions off and on all my life, but praise God He delivered me from both just before my incarceration, and I promised God I'll serve him till my dying day. Most all of my family is passed on, so this incarceration time has been a very lonely, a hard road, but God is my strength and carries me and helps me through each day. I have an awesome testimony that I'd love to give if interested. Thank you for your time & reply, and hopefully, prayerfully, all I've requested from you be sent to me. So....this happened. Last week I had my 6-month health check up on the old ticker...

The doctor said you need to lose about 40 pounds and start exercising. I wrestle horses for a living I told him. You need cardio work he replied.

So last week we passed a yard sale. In between the piles of unwanted baby clothes and pictures of Aunt Martha and the family were 2 bikes. Man, and a woman's bike. "Look at those" I replied to my better half. After rearranging the Honda CRV with all the dental tools, we were loaded and ready to try our new health machinery. My wife immediately rode hers around the black top drive. Doing wheelies and no hands maneuvers. I told her mine was still in the planning stages.

So this morning up at 3am I got into my Bible study. Afterward I took my walk to check on the horses.

I came back and under the vapor light I adjusted the seat of my new steed. All the way up. I thought I'll just go around the parking pad like my wife did when we brought our bikes home. I felt 30 years younger. I'll be 63 this Saturday. I was on my way to youth and vitality. Remembering my wife saying "these are mountain bikes" I got caught up "in it".

Off the parking pad is a dirt road that snakes around the garage up to the barn. Off to the right is a field where we keep Travis, Austin and Franklin. As I slowly ascended down the gravel road, I felt my newly acquired health machine picking up speed. I applied the brakes for the very first time. But at 320 pounds the little exercise tool was having a hard time slowing me down. At this instance I felt like a runaway locomotive. No problem I thought. As I slowly came to a stop the sound grew silent way way....off in the distance.

I dismounted and cried out. They came back around the field for the second time. I witnessed a track race. Passing each other in their haste to get away. After numerous whoa and calling their names they recognized my voice and quietly returned.

I pushed my new toy back up to the garage and parked it.

I realized that maybe I should just eat less and ride more. Get off and walk beside my horse.

When my wife awoke, I explained my ordeal. She went down onto one knee in laughter. Can you just imagine the shadow they saw coming at them?...Out of nowhere.

I gleefully acknowledged, "I'm giving my bike to one of the grandkids."

my pain did subside some and when I had my time with my daughter my heart was filled with love and all other problems slipped away.

10 years later my Stepfather was involved in a semi wreck. I was his immediate supervisor so the hospital where they had taken him called me to inform me of his condition and that they were flying him to a trauma hospital. My Mom was at my sister's house out of state taking care of the grandkids while their folks were on vacation. As I drove to the trauma hospital I called her to tell her what had happened. She was happy when she answered and as I slowly worked the words from my mouth as to what

had happened her voice went quiet and I could hear her sobbing. I arrived at the hospital and the doctors told me of my Dads condition. He was bleeding out guicker than they could pump new blood in. I called for a priest to preform Last Rites. I'll never forget my Dads reaction to what the Priest was saving even though he laid in induced coma, he didn't want to die and was letting us know it. He trembled while the Priest spoke and tears rolled down his cheeks. My Mom had caught a flight and was due in later that night. Some how the doctors stopped the bleeding, my Mom got to be with my stepfather while he was still alive. When not by his side I was in the Chapel down the hall, it was a very difficult time on the entire family. On the third day after his accident he passed away.

My Mom was never the same after that; she said she had lost all will to live without him. I would go to see her on weekends and we'd go to church. I kept going to A.A. and sharing what was happening in my life, looking for support, I stayed close to God in Prayer even though I didn't understand the whys of what had happened.

Three short years later my Mother passed away from stage four brain cancer. I truly believe she died of a broken heart and the lack of will to live.

Looking back I realize that during my many years of drinking I never really knew what pain was nor did I have the reasons or excuses for the life I lead.

I've come to believe that there is a reason for everything and as an all-knowing Heavenly Father, he knew what I was to be challenged with before it happened and stepped into my life to prepare me for what was to come.

Nearly 23 years after turning my life over to the care of God, I am so very thankful for the strength he gave me during those excruciating times of pain and only because of His Grace am I here today. He comforts me each day of my life and is with me throughout all my troubles. Each evening I am thankful for the day, each morning I pray for nearly an hour while driving to work and I'm mindful to be thankful for all his many mercies and miracles.

More than anything I am so thankful for His love.
