

MY name is Richard Pullins and I'm currently in prison and I've been locked up going on 4 years and in that time, I've found the Bible and Jesus Christ. A little how I ended up here is that I've been abusing drugs and alcohol since the age of 19. I've always held jobs and relationships, just never could get away from the booze and drugs. About 5 years prior to being arrested my drug use

turned a lot worse and led me to being locked up. The reason I was arrested is not the person I am or ever planned to be. But I keep telling myself that the worst thing I ever did, is the best thing that ever happened to



me because I found Jesus Christ and the Bible and I'm happy for that.

I don't know without all this happening in my life, if that would of ever happened. I have about 3 years; give or take, and I just want my faith and knowledge of the Word to grow strong. That brings me to the reason I'm writing you is that I don't have a lot of support on the outside and I'm looking for information on Bible Study Correspondence courses, daily devotions, Christian books and other Christian resources. I just want everyone to know that there is no one that is beyond God's saving power. I just hope my past failures will allow others to have hope.

We certainly want to continue to give them away as we go to share JESUS CHRIST and to minister. It is my desire to raise the funds to have another 22,500 printed and on hand to make the WORD

Love: Part #2 by Chaplain/Pastor J.C. Shook

If you read the part one series in the last Christian Ranchman than you know that relationship was mentioned and in a true relationship you must have love. This shouldn't be a worldly love but a divine love. There are so many scriptures that speak on love and the heart. In a reference to Google, it was mentioned that the Holy Bible refers to the heart approximately 856 times. In doing so, it often intertwines with love. Also, in the first part series of this, we spoke on the meaning of a true disciple. Which has me referring to an old Billy Graham devotional called, "Love In Action." Pastor Graham starts his message in this fashion, "Jesus said," "All men will know that you are my disciple, if you love one another" (John

13:35 NIV). "But how do we put that love into action?" Pastor Graham's reply was, "We serve one another, and the Lord modeled this when He washed His disciple's feet." I would think most of us in some capacity have served someone. But I will point out that there is a difference between worldly service and divine. For example, if someone is difficult, argumentative, or provoking a fight, it can be hard for us at times to show these individuals the love of Christ. This is possible when we rely on the Holy to those that are acting in such a manner. In Pastor Graham's reference to "the Lord modeled," I think about that and His great 4. do not be judgmental...This does love for His people. Our Lord and Savior left His perfect state to be in the form of a human to save many. For me that is the ultimate service and love. In this thought, I will spend my very last breath in learning and trying my best to reflect His love.

Many of us know, and, or have memorized John 3:16 but here are some other passages that I would recommend in memorizing and trying to reflect in your daily life. I would like to take us to Philippians 2:1-11, what does it mean to you to be "Christ-minded?" Then take a look at verses 3-4 and how many of us have had an issue with this at one time or another? Then in verse 5, "In your relationship with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:" All too often then I've seen the individual and the church fall short in this area. Then in verse 7-8 you see how our Lord and Savior takes on the very nature of a servant, even though having the very nature of God. This love and servitude and obedience went to the cross for our salvation, are you there yet in your walk?

Then I'm reminded of First Corinthians chapter 13 and Romans 8:31-39, we can see false ways of it if we do not have this divine love, that's referred in chapter 13. So, for those that have read the Romans passage I just referred to let me ask this, for those that are His disciples and have a relationship with Him; what will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus?

In closing of part #2, I would like to remind us all of the 'Cowboy Chaplain of America

Guideline 3', that I take to heart. "The Cowboy/Cowgirl Chaplain will accept the position of being a 'Spiritual Paramedic' or first responder in the case of problems, emergencies or crisis. As the Cowboy/Cowgirl Chaplain responds as a 'People Helper' they must have the proper attitude and;

- 1. be available...be there when needed. whenever and wherever
- 2. be compassionate... be sympathetic, understanding and caring
- Spirit that dwells in us to reflect such love 3. be a good listener... be quick to listen and slow to speak (except pray with those in need) to
 - not mean to condone their actions or behavior, but to allow the Holy Spirit to convict them and guide you as to how to minister in each situation.

This is just the beginning of Love! And please realize that these teaching barely scratch the surface, so it's up to you and the Lord how far and deep you can go. Think of it like this, you've been riding your horse for a while and come up to an area of woods and or forest. You happen to know that there is living water in those woods. Your horse can get you there to the living water but will you hold it back or even worst turn in the opposite direction. O' by the way you have been 3 days without water...

"God love" is 1 Jn.4:8.

Now fast forward to my adult years, and yes, I kept rodeoing and I was pretty good, so, I got a scholarship to college. After college I got married and had two beautiful kids and still rodeoed, but I kind of separated from God. Between working and trying to raise a family and still riding bulls. I let my life slip away from God. I still did pretty good, because I made a name for myself and am friends with a lot of famous people in the rodeo world. I thought that I was alone this whole time, but it took me losing everything for me to realize the ONE PERSON that was always with me and beside me the whole time. And that was the Most High Jesus Christ. Now I have been in prison for the last 15 years serving a 20-year sentence. It seems that no matter what I do or where I go, Jesus finds a way to get to me. Two people that I am friends with that are well known and well respected in the rodeo world have made their way back into my life and everything points to the Almighty. Back to Cowboys For Christ. A good friend in prison gave me a Cowboys For Christ newspaper. I didn't know that Cowboys For Christ had a newspaper or a Bible study; which is the main reason for this letter. I would like to receive the newspaper and the Bible study. I go to church every week, but still have a lot of down time. I am trying to fill my down time with good stuff. Thank you for lending an ear and doing what you do.

Ministry Report from Chaplain Joel Nupp

I was born 1957 on a horse farm outside Ellicott City, MD. All through the week hard work, but Sundays though belonged to the Lord. All through school years I was involved in riding, sports and church. My first job off the farm was mucking stalls for 25 cents an hour. I was riding cutting horses, too, for that cha same farm. I could sit a horse.

I worked on a beef farm during college that was up off Deep Creek Lake. I found the isolation and distance from my familiar church family, and I got lost. The world swallowed that little farm boy whole. I got married, and we had three kids. My wife got sick, and passed and I was lost again.

In 2004 I started my career in my new business; Friendship Equine Dentistry, L.L.C. It gave me a purpose, as I knew horses. But there was a void, an emptiness. Then I met my wife now, Sheryl in 2007. She was widower as well. I had raised 3 kids, and she had raised 4. We got married in our old barn. My mom and dad were maid of honor, and best man. We were equally yoked. I knew who I was, but there was unfinished business in my soul. In 2009 we started a Cowboys for Christ chapter out of our barn. Very few if any would come, but there were papers we had to fill out for our chapter. It kept talking about the Chaplain's program. I asked the president about this. He said you don't have to have a chaplain, but if you do, I can help you.....

I started preaching in 2013 for Maryland High School Rodeos. Three hay bales were my podium. I was so nervous I couldn't make spit. When I thanked the bull riders that had come, they told me the Lord kept them safe. I went back and told my wife. I'm all in.

My wife and I were ordained Nov 2 ,2015. The little farm boy that had a call to preach as a 12-year-old boy; was home.

I've done weddings, funerals, baptized babies. I've helped fill in for preachers. Many different churches, and many denominations. It doesn't matter. One God. I ride every day, every day. I sing and talk to God, and He talks to me. We still float horse's teeth sometimes. My wife does the paperwork, and takes care of the bills. We have met 100s, if not 1000s of people. I know every single one, they are special to me.

In closing, I preach because it's personal. On Jan. 1 2007 I died, to myself. The Lord saved me, lifted me, and filled my lungs;

changed my blood.

I preach because I want you to know this same Lord that saved me, and can save you. I'm the happiest I've ever been in my life.

Cowboys for Christ is non-denominational. We don't judge, we don't get a salary. We love. Come out and hear about this Jesus. It's FREE!

Palm Sunday Praises from Chaplain Dale Brenneman

I could give you many more testimonies of Him in my life, but there is not enough time or space to tell of my love, surrender and great desire to tell of Him. It is my desire and prayer that He will continue to allow me to tell of His redeeming love, as long as I live.

Riding Point With Dave Harvey...

Rev 19:16 On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS.

"LORD OF LORDS" is the title given to our Lord Jesus Christ and this title was already his in eternity past but this title was also earned by his death on the cross. It is so hard for us humans to understand the Biblical and eternal truth of victory through death, but that is truly what Jesus Christ achieved through his death on the "cross of Calvary." The two thieves, one on each side of him suffered death; one to glory

with our Lord and one to eternal darkness, but they still died beside of the LORD of LORDS.

Let's explore the title "Lord of lords" throughout the holy Scriptures to see the development of the truth of Jesus Christ and how we have, as God's children, gained victory through his death. We certainly do obtain eternal life, and we also gain the person of Jesus Christ through his sacrifice and through his blood when we accept him as our Savior and Lord. We are first introduced to this wonderful title of "Lord of lords." "**Deut. 10:16-17**"


One thing I would like to point out is that the references to our Lord throughout the Scriptures have it listed as: Lord of lords, with Lord capitalized and lords, not capitalized. In every verse, except "**Rev. 19:16**" where all letters are capitalized as "LORD OF LORDS" and this is when the title earned on the cross is confirmed with victory over the agent of death. Our Lord defeated death on the cross, but the agent of death, the devil, himself, has been allowed to continue his reign of terror through the years. But this will certainly stop with victory over him in this final battle, as is described in **Rev. 19:10-16**, as we will shortly see. But first, let's see the progression through the Scriptures as the Lord of lords is revealed in direct wording and in actual declarations down through the ages.

Jesus Christ is not only Lord of lords, but as we see in these verses from the great Book of Deuteronomy that he "shows no partiality and accepts no bribes" which is so wonderful, because he allowed even me to become his child. I certainly had nothing to offer him for the forgiveness of my sins and for eternal life, but that didn't matter to him. I was only to repent, believe and accept him as my Savior and Lord; making him "Lord of lords" of my life. But first I had to throw away my cowboy pride and allow the Holy Spirit to touch my heart of stone to understand and receive this wonderful, soul saving truth. Moses who wrote the Book of Deuteronomy used a Hebrew word to describe "cowboy pride" and the translators chose to use "stiff-necked" as they translated into English, but it sure means the same thing. Cowboys and cowgirls, that cowboy pride will get you into trouble a bunch, and we need to throw it away and get real when we are presented the truth of Jesus Christ. So, as Moses tells us; "do not be stiff-necked" any longer and receive the truth of the good news of Jesus Christ.

Please do not think that you are too bad, or have gone too far to be good enough to be a child of God. None of us are "good enough" and we could never be good enough to be accepted on our own merits. We are all sinners and we are all sinful; even down to our thoughts. Our hearts are hard and we are rebellious, but we are also human and we are all in need of a Savior, not only from the penalties of those sins, but from the effects of a sinful life. We are not good enough and we are not strong enough to fight the devil, but we can have a Savior who is good enough and strong enough. In fact, he is strong enough and he is willing, plus he has already paid the price for your sin debt, all you have to do is accept this free gift of salvation and accept the Savior, who also happens to be the Lord of lords.

What are we supposed to do when we do throw away our cowboy pride and accept Jesus Christ as our Lord of lords? Well, the very blessed and anointed Book of Psalms tells us very plainly in: "**Ps 136:1-3**" That we are to "give thanks" to our Lord of lords and we are to worship him, we are to spend time in fellowship with him, which means that we are to read and study his Holy Word. It would be so very hard to receive Jesus Christ as our Lord of Lords and not give him our attention on a daily basis. I don't see how he would feel like our Lord of lords, if we ignored him during the week, and just showed him honor on Sunday morning. Is he really your Lord of lords, then show him? Let him see your worship, your praise and your thanksgiving and spend time in his Holy Word and in prayer, every day. Let him know that he is your Lord of lords and let other know it too. Remember you have already thrown away your cowboy pride and you are no longer "stiff-necked" so act like it.

Our next reminder of our Lord of lords is in the New Testament in: "**1 Tim 6:12-16 12**" Boy, this sure tells us the whole story and in a hurry, because we are to "fight the good fight of the faith." Jesus Christ testified that he was the King of kings and the Lord of lords and we are to share this wonderful truth and to "keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ." And we are to keep the faith and keep fighting (sharing, testifying, witnessing, studying, reading, praying and believing) until our Lord of lords burst through the clouds in glorious brilliance on his white horse. *(Continued on Page 9)*





Lessons From Our Horses on The Fruit of the Spirit:Peace by Barb McMillan

Galatians 5:22-23 - But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol; against such things there is no law.

In my previous articles, I shared some of the ways that working with my horses at Liberty illustrates how God works in my own life to bring my stubborn, willful heart into submission to Him so I can enjoy being in that safe spot of His love, experiencing joy regardless of the circumstances in my life. I cannot work to produce the Fruit of the Spirit, but I can practice daily spiritual disciplines such as prayer, Bible study, and fellowship with other Christians, which enable the Holy Spirit to flow more freely through me to meet the heart needs of other people.

According to the Bible, there are three dimensions to Peace: 1) peace with God through the saving grace and work of Jesus Christ 2) peace in our relationships with other people and 3) peace in our own hearts, that is, freedom from anxiety and worries because we are confident that God is in control.

- The most important kind of peace comes from reconciliation with God thru the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit when we receive Jesus as Savior and Lord.
- Romans 5:1, 6, 8 assures us that we have peace with God through Jesus because Christ died for us, the ungodly, and reconciled us with the Father.
- And in Ephesians 2:14, we learn that Jesus Christ Himself is our peace – He bridged the divide between the old sinful man (us!) and Holy God.
- Flowing out from our new connection to God is the peace that comes from turning over our anxiety and worries because God is in control of every situation in our lives.
- In John 14:27, Jesus promised that He would give us His peace that is so powerful that we can trust Jesus and not be troubled or afraid even in dire circumstances. Jesus said this is not the world's kind of temporary peace based





on politics or possessions or vague promises, but something much greater. And in Philippians 4:6,7 we read, Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God which transcends all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

- Reconciliation with one another, and harmonious relationships should be the natural outflow of our new life in Christ and our freedom from worry, but obviously many of us struggle with this. The Scriptures are full of admonitions to live at peace with one another.
- In I Thessalonians 5:13, 14 Paul commanded us to live in peace with one another, encouraging the timid, helping the weak, being at peace with everyone.

We see this in our horses a lot, don't we? When our horses are not at peace with each other, they are constantly nipping, biting, chasing with ears flattened, rearing, striking out or kicking, and playing endless games for dominance, just like Little Lincoln and Big Willie playing "gladiator games" to establish who is the Big Man on Campus (or in the pasture, I should say) whenever Stella is around. You would think that Little Lincoln, being a pony only half the size of Big Willie, would have made peace with Willie long ago, but his stubborn pony pride gets in his way. Sounds a little like us, doesn't it?

However, our horses are a real joy when they are at peace with each other – under saddle, they are content to ride at the beginning, middle or end of a group of horses going out on the trail; in the

pasture, we watch them grazing quietly side-by-side; or as in the photo, laying down in the pasture contentedly side by side, just enjoying one another's company. When our horses are at peace with us, and the care and training we give to them, they are generally obedient and pleasant; they come quickly and cheerfully when we call them. But if our horses have experienced neglect, abuse or just harsh treatment from humans, they often become fearful and suspicious, anxious, jiggy, expecting the worst, ready to explode at any little thing.

I have learned how important that attitude of peace is when I do Liberty training with multiple horses. My horses MUST be at peace with themselves and with the other horses, and must TRUST and OBEY me completely, or things fall apart quickly in my little arena. Starting with "Team Up", I teach two horses to "glue" themselves side-by-side to each other, and stand contented, not agitated *(Continued on Page 11)*

or fearful of the other horse, not trying to escape back to their stalls. I ask both horses to either move together at my signal (circle around me; walk, trot, canter, halt, back) or, ask one horse to leave the other and follow my directions while my stationary "anchor" horse stands still. So I might direct one horse to trot around a cone or walk to the line of laiddown barrels and sidepass them, then come back to the anchor horse and Team Up again.

Herd dependence sometimes keeps the horses from paying attention to and obeying ME, and the Team Up horses might either merrily canter off together when I asked just one of the to circle the cone and trot back, or both just stand there with a hind foot cocked and do nothing that I ask! Needless to say, disobedience does not lead to peace!

What a great reminder of the three types of peace God wants us to experience – peace with Him through Jesus, peace within our own hearts through the Holy Spirit, and peace with those around us. And that confidence of who I am in Christ gives me peace in the midst of difficult circumstances.

My Testimony by Richard Arrington

I was born March 17th 1975. I'm the youngest, my sister being 4 years older than me. At the age of 6 months, I had back surgery to remove a lipoma mass which had a bone in it that was attached to my spinal cord. The doctors told my parents that I could die or be paralyzed the rest of my life! I was able to come through that surgery. On March 13th 1978 my dad committed suicide just 4 days before my birthday. My mom decided to move in with my grandparents, and my aunt and uncle also live there. There was always chaos and unrest with family feuds because my grandpa's sister lived next door to us. So, it was always arguing or fighting between somebody. I remember sitting at the dinner table and an argument would break out. Family would be cursing and screaming with each other. We lived with my grandparents for approximately 4 years. My grandfather had Hodgkin's disease and

was a World War II vet. I watched him go through failing health for many years and even face death a couple of times. My mom decided to remarry a man whom she met, who just turned out to be nothing more than an alcoholic gambler and a physical and mental abuser. She divorced him after a year and a half. I grew up in hopes that the story about my Dad committing suicide wasn't true; I had hope all my life it was from an accident from cleaning his shotgun. Well at the age of 48 the truth came out with documents that it was ruled by. I guess you can say I felt abandoned my whole life because of what my dad did! There were many nights I just cried myself to sleep. I grew up playing sports, basketball, baseball, football. I wanted to be like my cousin Charles Ray or be like Tony Dorset of the Dallas cowboys and be a football star! But due to my back condition and an injury in seventh grade, my football career ended short. Not even knowing what was going on, I allowed anger to get a hold of me. I was active in boy scouts and an Eagle scout. And an active Chaplain and a very active outdoorsman; horseback riding, hunting and fishing etc.

I grew up going to church all my life, so I knew who Jesus was but I never knew him on a personal basis. I guess you can say I owe my faith to my grandfather who always looked at me and said you have to have faith in God. I never really knew what that meant till I got older. In the summer of 1988, I went to a concert at Glen Hope Baptist Church where I attended as a youth. I remember that night I wore a green button-up shirt and blue jeans and I sat towards the back. I guess you could call me a back row Baptist! (Lol) but something strange happened that night. At the end of the concert, we sang a song called "Just as I Am" Not really knowing the song I felt something pulling on my inner soul, my inner being and the stronger it pulled the tighter I griped the back of the pew in front of me but something kept telling me to just let go! In what seemed to feel like minutes on end, I decided to let go and I asked Jesus to save me that night. I wasn't moved by what the preachers spoke about. I wasn't moved

by what the singers testified about. I was feeling something drawing on my heart that was turning my heart into putty, which had become hardened through my childhood!

I went on quite a few mission trips through my youth, but after graduating high school and going into the work field, I slowly began to drift from God. I knew at the age about 19 and 20 I was called to preach. I had the calling of God to preach but then I had the devil threatening to kill me if I decided to go preach the Word of God. But out of fear and running with the wrong crowd I threw in the towel and started drifting from God and hanging out at Honky Tonks on a regular weekend basis, drinking smoking etc. In 1999 I would be married with my first child in 2004, and I had my 2nd child in 2005. I was faced with another back surgery, and this time having family and kids. I was told the same; I could either possibly die or be paralyzed to have this lipoma mass with a bone in it that was attached to my spinal cord, that had it pulled and tethered.

So, I decided to reach for scripture and I read every verse, so I can find healing all the way through the procedure and even after the surgery and even after the surgery was successful, I ended up with MRSA and I had to have another surgery to have antibiotics flush through my body! The whole time I basically had to live by faith just like my grandpa taught me growing up, I had to cling to the Word of God and use His Word and mix it with Faith to get through this. I'm still doing well today. I'm still very active and I can still ride a horse; go fishing, go hiking, camping, whatever I may choose.

I can be honest with everyone about my younger years, as I lived like a heathen dog from hell. But over the last 15 years, God has had to discipline me and get me in a quiet place, a restricted place and talk to me by using His Word and other ministers to bring me back to Him. I made a lot of mistakes in my early years of adulthood. I've been delivered from alcohol and tobacco products and I'm still on the journey. It was about 2010. I got in such a dark place and I started searching for God again. I tried to *(Continued on Page 12)*

My life kind of makes me think about Job. If you lose it all, are you still going to trust and have faith in God!
