My Testimony

When I was young my mother took me to church every Sunday, my father was not a Christian and did not attend with us. My mothers love for Christ allowed me to hear the Gospel at a young age, and at 7 years old, I realized I was a sinner because I did things that God stated not to. I understood that this sin separated me from God, but he sent His son, Jesus Christ to die for me, and His blood was able to forgive all my sins. I remember so vividly sitting in a folding chair in the basement of LaGrange First Baptist Church in Ohio, during Jr. Church and asking God to forgive me of all my sins and to live within my heart. A few years later my father also accepted Christ as his Savior and began to worship with us at church along with my younger brothers.

Unfortunately, as I grew older, I watched, as children do, and I learned... We were from a small rural community where everyone knew everyone and everything that was happening. Things I saw and were taught at church, applied then, on Sundays and Wednesday nights, but during the week outside of church, I observed a different set of values and way to live being displayed by many.

As I entered my late teens, approaching graduation and I had come to a point where I was rationalizing and justifying sin in my life and it got to the point where I couldn't even hear the Holy Spirit within me. Then as things went wrong in my life, I blamed God for them and couldn't understand how He could let these things happen in my life. For

the next 30 years, I ran from God, because He may love other people, but He surely didn't love me, and as I ran, I dove deeper and deeper into sin to the point most people who knew me would have never guessed I really did believe in God. I chewed tobacco. drank, smoked & swore, was prideful and arrogant and one miserable person inside. But I put on a show and no one knew just how deeply I was hurting inside... Except God. Thru all those years the Holy Spirit kept speaking to me. And I began to listen. I finally was able to accept what I knew to be true for so many years. The problems in my life were not from God, but allowed as consequences. Consequences for not being close to Him as I should have, in daily devotions and a true walk with him. For putting my faith in people to teach me how to live instead of The Word. For allowing sin and pride into my life. All the major problems I had over my life that I blamed God for, were in fact MY FAULT, because of my failures to follow Him as I should. I'm NOT saying that everything bad that happens is because of sin, but I'm referring to specific things I can trace to sin in my life, like my first wife who kicked me out and moved another guy into the house a few days later - I met her while drunk at a bar. My fault.

In 2019, I met my future wife, she was also a Christian, but hurt and not living as she should just like me. As we grew closer and were preparing for our future and wedding, we both realized we were missing the most important part in our lives. A true relationship with Christ.

We both had a lot of issues we had to get right with Christ, and we began to seek His guidance. The Holy Spirit jumped at me with this realization and right away showed me where my downhill started. I did not have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ which I strove to build and desired to grow DAILY. Before He was just on a shelf with my Bible that I picked up when convenient. I looked to others to show me how to live by example instead of learning by the example of the one I should have been looking to – Jesus Christ (John 21:20-21).

Went to school in Shreveport, LA, then moved to East Texas to a little town called White Oak after dropping out of high school to help my grandfather with bills after my grandmother passed away. I started working in the oil filed on workover rigs when I was 18 and been there ever since.

I got married and had my share of the family life when I was in my 20s, which I call my "Super Dad" years. I thought I was doing it all right and had started raising my stepson at 1 years old, then 3 years later me and my ex-wife had my biological son. For these 10 years or so I feel as I lived my best life. I bought a home, which I still own, and I hope to still have when I'm released from prison very soon. I'm proud of most of my 20s and the beginning of my 30s. Even though I worked, I'm what I call a functioning alcoholic and addict. It has always been alcohol and a little weed that has hung me up. I didn't experience a rough, tough life on the bottom until after my divorce in my early 30s. At this point, I did still try to do the weekend warrior dad thing, and even pay my child support as well as get my boys on the weekend. Which I still have custody of right now, but they are 19 years old and 16 years old now, basically grown men.

I have not been the dad I was the last 6 or 7 years that I know I should've been. After the divorce, I spiraled out of control when she said she was moving 10 hours across Texas. I lost hope and lost connection to my sons, my life, my world, my everything when she up and moved and remarried. I made some bad choices and got myself to a very dark place and bottom of my life. I involved myself with people and women I never should have, made poor choices and wound up in jail on my first felony offense. This opened my eyes a lot, and I have done 4 years in jail now on a 6-year sentence. I have made my first parole, and was in a faith-based dorm praying and crying out to God to please let me out so I don't miss any more of my boys' lives.

I missed my oldest son's high school graduation, which will forever hurt my heart.

My son that is 15 years old will be graduating soon, and I'm doing everything I can to get out, do what's right, work hard bettering myself with every opportunity I can in here. I've completed Bridges to Life, Overcomers, Anger Management, gotten my G. E. D., as well as strengthened my walk with God to where I know what I want and have faith in God and in myself to get out back into society being the best version of myself to date. I feel I can still live my best life possible with all I have learned about God's word and how to walk the walk when I get out soon.

I still need help and am begging anyone – someone to take a chance on me again and let me prove I can do this and leave my sons a legacy they will be proud of. I am waiting on a release date and am just waiting on a halfway house to accept me and send an approval acceptance letter.

I need someone's helping hand and Cowboy brotherly love to stand beside me while I reintegrate into society successfully. I don't want to fail and don't want to live my old life anymore. I'm done saying that I don't have anyone because I have my Father God on my side now and know I can be an asset to His Kingdom, to a new spiritual family's everyday life, and walk with God doing my best job yet in life. Be here for me in Jesus' Holy Name.

A Cowbov Chaplain is called to serve the MOST HIGH GOD and fulfill the commission from our LORD in Mark 16:15. That commission is to "GO" and Cowboy Chaplains accept that calling to "GO" wherever and whenever possible to proclaim, to witness, to reach out to the lost. Riding Point With Dave Harvey...

THE CROSS BEFORE THE CROWN

Luke 24:25-31 25 Then he said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and to enter into his glory?" 27 Beginning from Moses and from all the prophets, he explained to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself. 28 They drew near to the village, where they were going, and he acted like he would go further. 29 They urged him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is almost evening, and the day is almost over." He went in to stay with them. 30 It happened, that when he had sat down at the table with them, he took

the bread and gave thanks. Breaking it, he gave to them. 31 Their eyes were opened, and they recognized him, and he vanished out of their sight.

There has been so much teaching and preaching on these verses and on the whole discourse of the two disciples of Jesus Christ that had left Jerusalem and were headed to Emmaus. They were leaving Jerusalem at a very difficult time with feelings of defeat in their lives, as it had been three days since the Messiah had been crucified on the cross. Or at least, they had hoped and thought Jesus was the Messiah, as we are told in; Luke 24:19-21. Evidently the two had been with Jesus for a while, although probably not one of the eleven, as we must exclude Judas, because he had committed suicide after he betrayed Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. There are some that think that the other one may have been Luke, but there is no way this can be confirmed. But they certainly seem to have the attitude of everyone involved, as early that morning even the ladies who had been a big part of the ministry group had gone to the tomb to anointed the body of Jesus, fully expecting his body to be there where he was placed just three days before.

Jesus addressed these two disciples as being "foolish" and "slow of heart to believe" as they were trying to make sense of all of the happenings, instead of having faith in the Holy Scriptures and the teaching of the Messiah. Truly their lives had been "turned upside down" over the events of the last week, and they surely felt lost and greatly confused. But then the great Teacher went through the Old Testament to reveal the truths that are there and should have been known by these followers of Jesus Christ. What a wonderful privilege to be taught these truths by the Master, and to have him walk you through the movements leading up to the salvation of mankind by way of the cross. But, was there a reason they were shocked, disheartened and very much in despair because of their Messiah being crucified by the religious leaders and the Roman authorities. Had all the proceedings leading up to the arrest and crucifixion of our Lord been hidden from them, and they were totally unprepared with the crucifixion, the death and the burial of their Messiah. It sure seems that they were certainly caught off guard and shaken to their very souls because of the tragic happenings of the cross and were left in total despair. What about today, are many of God's children still in the dark as to the second coming of our Lord?

As we study and search the Scriptures leading up to the betrayal, the unlawful court hearing and the crucifixion of our Lord, we see that the great teacher and Messiah had actually spent much time in trying to prepare his disciples for the events that were to take place on their arrival in Jerusalem. We are told in: "Mark 9:30-32. This certainly seems to be very plain and to the point and should have been received by everyone of his followers, but they evidently had their own ideas of their "Messiah" and it surely wasn't death or a cross. But, we as followers and believers of Jesus Christ are sure not like this today, now, are we? We are not forming our own ideas of how it will work out and have complete trust and faith in our Savior and Lord, right? And surely, we are prepared for his coming in the clouds, as declared in; 1 Th. 4:16-17.

Throughout the entire Holy Word of God, we are told of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, who is God's one and only Son. And especially about him and of the events and happenings; in some cases, hundreds and even thousands of years before they would come about. We are given details of all the actions that did take place, truly as had been told by the prophets. The cross of Jesus Christ had to come first, before the crown, but not his crown, because he has always had, has now and will always have his many crowns. Jesus Christ is the Son of God; he is the KING OF KINGS and LORD OF LORDS and he has never lost his crown. He did lay his crown aside to become our Savior by dying on the cross, but he didn't die for his crown, he died for our crown as we are told in: "James 1:12 Blessed is the man who endures temptation, for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life, which he promised to those who love him." And in: "Rev 2:8-10 8 "To the angel of the church in Smyrna write: "The first and the last, who was dead, and has come to life says these things: 9 "I know your afflictions and your poverty (but you are rich), and the blasphemy of those who say they are Jews, and they are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. 10 Do not be afraid of the things which you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested; and you will have oppression for ten days. Be faithful to death, and I will give you the crown of life."






2024 in SE Missouri and Southern Illinois



Running the Race

Have you ever thought to yourself; "is the Lord currently pleased with how I'm running the race of life in being his disciple?' All of us have gone too far left or right on the straight and narrow track God has set before us. How many times have we taken the wrong path or just gave up in some aspect of life? I have and I am reminded of what the Apostle Paul said to God's holy people in Christ Jesus at Philippi. "Phil 2:12-13 So then, my beloved, even as you have always obeyed, not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. 13 For it is God who works in you both to will and to work, for his good pleasure." How are you working this passage into your race?

The other night I was watching the movie "American Underdog" the true story of Kurt Warner. I watched as Kurt ran through the adversity he was up against. Kurt had the desire to be an NFL quarterback, but came across many obstacles along the way. His college coach was tough on him and even benched him. The Green Bay Packers let him go on the second day of tryouts, because he wasn't prepared. He was working at a supermarket and him and his wife could not make ends meet. The kids were sick and the electricity went out because they couldn't pay the bill. During a blizzard. Kurt decided to take his family

to his mom's house, but they ran out of gas on the way. It was 5 miles or more to the nearest gas station and Kurt had to run it both ways, because he was afraid his family would freeze to death in the cold car. As he ran Kurt cried out to God, as he was running back with a full can of gas. Against all odds Kurt eventually became a pro quarterback and won the super bowl. Kurt is a devoted Christian and signs his autographs with different Bible verses.

While watching Kurt run, I was examined my run of times past to the present in my mind. I thought about how I was running with my unit and all of the sudden I see these soldiers in all black pass us like we were stranding still. It was the 1st Ranger Battalion Special Forces Company and I thought to myself that I wanted to be in that unit. Then one day I was jogging with my company 2/75th Ranger Battalion and we were training for a future joint mission with other Special Forces units to get Osama Bin Kaden. I remember being in awe when I saw Navy Seals and Delta Force men running by. But then I thought about how was I running the race for my Lord?

In our race we must consider what Jesus taught in: "Luke 9:23 He said to all, "If anyone desires to come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me." Most of us at some time in our lives have been in some kind of contest. It's usually beneficial to have a coach in many different aspects of competition. Many well-known athletes today have a sports psychologist to counsel them before and after a contest, so I will intertwine some parallels in running a race for worldly competition and in service for our Lord and Savior. And the things we need to consider for the race of our life and soul.

First, we must prepare for our contest and our race. In John 14:26 Jesus tells us that he will give us a superior counselor to all others, the Holy Spirit. Jesus explains that the Spirit of truth will live in us and will guide us into all truth. Then as if that wasn't convincing enough; Jesus says, "John 16:33 "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world

you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." We need to know that this is a crucial statement and promise and take it to heart and apply it to our lives and race.

Second, you had better believe there will be all kinds of hinderances to the runner that need to be avoided. In this competition you must consider what you are feeding your body, because you must run a winning race. And we must keep in mind two important truths, as is told in: "Gal 5:7 You were running well! Who interfered with you that you should not obey the truth?" And "2 Tim 2:3-5 3 Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. 4 No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs — he wants to please his commanding officer. 5 Similarly, if anyone competes as an athlete, he does not receive the victor's crown unless he competes according to the rules."

Third, we must press on and strive toward the goal and prize. Millions of people just witnessed some amazing athletes in the Olympics strive towards the prizes and hundreds of metals were given to those that placed in the top three positions. This certainly reminds us of the Apostle Paul declaring in: "Phil 3:14 I press on toward the goal for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." So, what prize are you striving to obtain; worldly or of God? Please keep in mind the lord's Word in: "James 4:4b Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." What is first in your life; the world, or God? I pray that at the end of your race you will be like the Apostle Paul: "2 Tim 4:7-8 7 I have fought the good fight. I have finished the course. I have kept the faith. 8 From now on, there is stored up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that day; and not to me only, but also to all those who have loved his appearing."

THE CROSS BEFORE THE CROWN Continued

Jesus Christ is the "first and last, who died and came to life again." Just as is plainly stated in: "Heb 13:8." The "crown of life" promised by the giver of life, Jesus Christ. His cross had to come before our crown and he knew it and he tried to tell his disciples this truth, but they chose to ignore, or just did not understand. Do you understand? Are you choosing to ignore this truth, that is clearly outlined, described and declared in God's Holy Word? Please don't be embarrassed, if you just don't understand, but you can sure do just what the Messiah did and go through the Holy Scriptures to show and prove that Jesus Christ, was, is and always will be the Son of God, who loved so much; the Holy Father and his creation, sinful mankind, that he went to the cross, so we could have a crown; the crown of life.

You may be saying, Oh, I'm a disciple of Jesus Christ; just like those two disciples on the road to Emmaus. You may be thinking that I am a follower of Jesus Christ, but are you living in this truth? Are you sharing this truth? These two men had been followers of Jesus, and they were caught off guard by the enemy, when they really shouldn't have been. They were scared, running away and maybe even ready to turn back to Judaism. They may have been ready to give up and leave their lives of serving the Lord. But the Master of their souls, came looking for them and he taught them and he gave them the truth, and then these disciples invited him into their lives. And the Savior even went in to eat with them and revealed himself to them as he blessed the meal. What about you, will you invite the Savior into your life? We are told in: "Rev 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, then I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with me."

I want to share another truth to you: Rev 3:20 Jesus Christ was talking to the church of Laodicea, which was a group of his followers and he declares in: "Rev 3:14-16 14." Cowboys and cowgirls, these are hard words, but they are true words, as

our Lord went to the cross for your and my crown of life and he is also seeking to walk with you and to talk to you and to help you through this life of pain, frustrations, disappointments and despair; as well as, service to your Lord and Savior. Jesus Christ walked with his disciples and he taught his disciples and he revealed the truth to his disciples, so they would share his truth to others. In fact, the Master made such an impression on them that they immediately ran off to tell others about their Savior and Lord. They went in great haste to declare that their Lord is alive and ready and able to save anyone and everyone from their life of sin and give them the "crown of life."

I would like to close with these questions. What are you doing to declare the truth of Jesus Christ to your loved ones, your family, your fellow workers, your fellow cowboys and cowgirls. Are you discussing him with other? Or are you running scared in this sinful and troubled world? Do you see the evil, but ignore or forget to share the Gospel, or even pray for those that are bound up in sin and misery. Are you dropping to your knees in prayer for those that are lost or just don't understand that their crown of life is free to them and the Savior is ready and able to walk with them on their road of loneliness, pain and despair. Maybe you are on "the road to Emmaus" and are having a tough time, or thoughts of hopelessness or fear, especially since the times are so evil and the world is so up-side down. Jesus Christ went looking for his wandering disciples, his followers and he is searching for you. Listen to him and study his Holy Word through the power and strength of the Holy Spirit as he walks beside of you in this journey called, life. "Rev 3:11 I am coming quickly! Hold firmly that which you have, so that no one takes your crown." GOD bless as you seek and serve Jesus Christ. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

A Living Memorial




