

Cowboys For Christ Chaplains Attend International Ranch Ministry Conference

Wings of Hope, a biblically based equine assisted learning ranch in Doswell, Virginia, was the site of the 2025 International Ranch Ministry Conference in late September. Four Cowboys For Christ Chaplains joined 300 other attendees for the three-day event. Roxie and Cary Stultz from Pennsylvania, and Bert Lambdin from Florida, joined Jesse Bowman from Virginia. Attendees representing 76 ministries from across the country and including Germany and Norway came together to fellowship, worship and share best practices and strategies in a wide variety of equine ranch related and ministry topics.

The annual conference included 60 one-hour educational sessions on topics ranging from equine ministry, programming, volunteer management, horse training and other related areas. Crystal Peaks Youth Ranch was able to send three of their staff members to lead sessions.

That was a special treat for similar ministries who might not be able to travel to Oregon to hear from a ministry that inspired so many to start outreach of this type.

Cowboys For Christ has been invited to participate in the conference for the last three years. This year, Chaplain Jesse Bowman presented two sessions on initiating a Cowboy church into your

ministry program. Both sessions drew people from across the spectrum of equine ministry as well as folks who do not currently use horses in a ministry-based program. Faith, Hope and Horses, an equine rescue and bible-based ministry in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, sent several volunteers, as well as the ministry director to the conference. The first fruits of the sessions were realized when Faith, Hope and Horses held their first Cowboy Church in November. They are actively working to incorporate cowboy church into their regular ministry program.

The hospitality expressed by Wings of Hope staff and volunteers was outstanding. The conference included amazing food prepared and served by Wings of Hope volunteers each day. Each evening attendees were treated to contemporary praise music by the band 1499. The band is led by recording artist Sam Gatto, who has a passion for bringing worship outside the walls of the church. The band's name is inspired by Luke 15:1-7, because you and I are the (1) for (4) whom Jesus left the ninety-nine (99). Next to a photo of a completely washed-out driveway bridge were the words: "Fall rains washed out the driveway bridge" . . . and right below that was a photo of the new bridge with the caption, "God provided a new one!" That simple yet profoundly direct statement of faith, trust and thanksgiving seemed to me to be the theme of the weekend celebration. I also learned that it was no little event that washed out the bridge. Nearly eleven feet of water surged through the normally placid stream and completely

evident to everyone who comes in contact with them. Kelsey's testimony was a tribute and a shining example of the genuine concern, care, and comfort that makes Glory Reins Ranch a very special place. All that visit the ranch, no matter what they think they are searching for, will find that authentic love, care, and concern at no cost other than a willingness to listen.

On Sunday morning we were treated to a wonderful breakfast and I was blessed to offer a message at Cowboy Church. Glory Reins Ranch operates solely on the provision of God and through the generosity of others. As ranch activities continue to expand, a wellness barn to care for the maturing herd has become necessary. This will provide a safer environment for feedings, a dry and warm place for stalling older horses, as well as a safer place for humans treating

the horses. A team of workers has already volunteered to help build the barn. Please pray for the funds needed to accomplish this addition. As I am writing this article, I have a deep sense that the Spirit of God is already at work in the provisions needed for Glory Reins Ranch to continue to offer the Love of Christ to anyone who visits.

Fall 2025 Women's Retreat

Women's Retreat Continued

We received the disappointing news that there was not a women's retreat because there was no one to lead it. Well, God definitely had us all in the right place at the right time because we looked at each other and said, "We'll do it!"

The first retreat was held in the fall of 2024 with 17 women, from teenagers to senior citizens, in attendance. We drove through Hurricane Helene on the way there. This storm devastated the western part of NC, but the campground was spared. Some of the participants from western NC came early to beat the storm and stayed extra days because they didn't have power at home. The theme of this first retreat was 1 Peter 3:15 "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." God showed up in a big way, giving us meaningful fellowship and plenty of horse-riding time.

Believing that God was blessing this ministry, a second retreat was scheduled for the spring of 2025. The word was spreading; we saw God bring 20 ladies to the weekend. We even had women attend without a horse. The theme of this weekend was 1 Thessalonians 5:1 "So encourage each other and build each other up, just as you are already doing." And the Lord helped us build each other up in powerful ways.

The third women's retreat was held October 3-5, 2025. We saw familiar faces from previous retreats, along with new faces, for a total of 30 ladies. The focus of this retreat was Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up." The Friday evening program started with a beautiful, delicious charcuterie table. Carmalee Scarpitti then brought the devotional. She shared that we need other Christians alongside us to make our way easier. But sometimes, like the footprints in the sand poem, it is Jesus who lifts us up.

We ended the evening with a game where everyone started with a wrapped gift that they had to trade multiple times. It was fun and a great time of fellowship. Just when everyone thought the game was over and the gifts, they unwrapped was theirs to keep, a twist was thrown in! You had to find someone you did not know and exchange your gift with that person. That was how we established our prayer partners for the weekend.

Saturday morning devotions were presented by Chaplain Cindy LaChance. She spoke about acknowledging that sometimes we are the person who needs the help to get up. But many of us have been taught to hide behind an "everything is great" mask. We must make sure our pride does not get in the way of allowing someone to minister to us. After morning devotions, the ladies with mounts went trail riding and the others enjoyed fellowship in the camp.

That afternoon, Danny Blackburn presented from horseback, helping us see how our relationship with our horses is similar to our relationship with God. We want our horse to be obedient and listen to us just as God wants His children to be obedient to Him. Just as we use hand, weight, and voice aids with our horses God gives us the aids of scripture, prayer, and fellow believers to help us on our journey. We need daily time in the Word, fellowship with and guidance from believers, and to spend our quiet time praying and listening to God. The night finished with dinner, a craft and lots of fellowship.

I get another chance, January 1st (my daughter's birthday) to go home and start over and I'm excited to do it with God this time. I'd like to check out anything I can get from your movement, Cowboys For Christ. Please add me for a Bible and sign me up for the Christian Ranchman. I'll be sure to get ahold of y'all upon my release and would love to share my testimony for

people who may need to hear it.

I've put the Brotherhood life behind me, although I still love all my brothers. I now just offer the help of prayer and spreading the good Word. I'll be waiting to hear from y'all. God bless! Keep doing God's mission.

Below is a testimony shared with me from one of our teachers here at Red Top Middle School. As you probably remember, we gave out 150 English and 100 Spanish copies of the Cowboys for Christ, Gospel of John here at our school. So far 3 kids have been saved here at school as a result. Also, the lady who heads up the Bible study here shared this testimony below with me. God is using that small seed of 250 Copies of the Gospel of John and Multiplying it.

I am a teacher in a public middle school. A fellow teacher in my school named Mr. Barnes who is involved in Rodeo Ministry and a ministry called Cowboys for Christ. At our school, we have a weekly Bible club called Vida Nueva - New Life. Mr. Barnes donated Cowboys for Christ Gospels of John (from the Pocket Testament League) in both English and Spanish to give out to the students in the Bible club. These have been a huge blessing to our students in the Bible club and other students that I have been able to share them with.

My dad has recently had to move to an inpatient rehab nursing home. One day while I was sitting with my dad, he was sleeping. I had some of the Cowboys for Christ Gospels of John with me in my bookbag, and I took one over to offer to my dad's roommate in the nursing home. His roommate is a man who had been shot in the head and is now partially paralyzed. He was glad to receive it. I asked him if he would like for me to read it with him while my dad was sleeping. I read the tract at the beginning and when I asked him if he would like to pray to receive Christ he said YES!

I gave him 5 and so far, he has given away 2. When I have a chance, we read John together and so far, we have read up to chapter 5. When I asked him to share any prayer requests so I could pray for him, he asked me to pray that he could keep getting closer to Jesus.

Praise the Lord for preserving his life and saving him! Praise the Lord for all the lives of students who have been touched through the Gospels of John shared through the Bible club!

Additional story - when I saw the Pocket Testament League Gospels of John that Mr. Barnes shared with me, I fell in love with them! I love the tract at the beginning and the way that the tract refers to the verses from John that can be looked up and shared. I have since ordered Gospels of John in French, Chinese, Portuguese, and Farsi to share with my students. Some of my students asked for more copies to share with friends and family. I am now ordering 300 Greatest Gift Gospels for our youth group to share with all the residents and nurses at my dad's nursing home.

The Narrow Gate

We were honored to be invited to lead a Sunday service for the Back Country Horsemen of Missouri, held at the picturesque Brushy Creek near Black, Missouri. The event took place during an unseasonably warm and drought-ridden September. Despite the weather, members came together for their annual meeting, enjoyed a member appreciation dinner, played fun games, participated in a silent auction, and rode the horses that God has blessed them with

The members who typically provided worship music were unable to attend this year. Tim and I, while not gifted singers, often refer to our efforts as making a joyful noise. However, God graciously provided not one, but two talented individuals—Toni Giardina and Stephen Assenmacher—who both played guitar and sang beautifully, uplifting the service with their music.

The devotion centered around Matthew 7:13-14, "Enter by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by it.

Because narrow is the way which leads to life, and there are few who find it." There are many today who proclaim all paths lead to God, but this is simply not true. If we leave mid Missouri and drive 1000 miles north, we will not arrive in Florida, though someone from Rhode Island driving south 1000 miles just might. Nor do the Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist etc. religions lead to the One True God.

We shared that people on the broad path and the narrow path often share these three things. 1. They believe that Jesus is Lord. 2. They are passionate about their beliefs. And 3. They are active volunteers.

The differences that those on the narrow path have are: 1. They have a grasp of God's grace. Nothing we do compares to what Jesus did for us. He led a sinless life, died and rose again in payment for our sin. All we do in our flesh is like filthy rags comparatively. And 2. On the narrow path we learn to surrender to God's will. We come

to realize God is not like a wish granter for the things we want. We must submit to Him and be His servants.

Theresa described parallel stories about gates and getting off the trail and being lost. She asked attendees for examples and folks shared some gate stories. The Bible was referred to as God's Compass and GPS, God's Positioning System. Prayers were sent up, and literature was offered. We were very honored to share God's Word and hope.

and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' 14 "For many are invited, but few are chosen."

This past March, I had a moment in church; a pivotal moment; a moment where I realized I was that man in street clothes who showed up to a wedding banquet dressed inappropriately. I wanted the food and the festivities, and the celebration, but I was not committed to the event. I was not honoring the King. I was not in relationship with His Son. I was in attendance physically and mentally, but not wholeheartedly. I thought I was saved when I was 48 years old. 20 years ago. Maybe I was. I believed in God and in Jesus and in the Holy Spirit. I came to learn more about God. I read the Bible; I even studied apologetics. I knew in my head that this made sense. What other reason but God could there be for the existence of the universe and life on earth? What reason for our existence, what purpose, to what end is this life worth living for? I was ordained with Cowboys for Christ in 2016. Yet, there was still no personal relationship because I had never surrendered. I had never given up fighting the fight myself; battling against life and circumstances; guarding my heart against submission; against doing it God's way. Covering my eyes and my ears, I was protecting myself because surely, I know better than God. Sound familiar to anyone? So, on that day in church, an altar call was made and my eyes were finally opened. My ears heard the call in a new and transforming way. As I stood there with the congregation, in a dimly lit church, I cried. Streams of tears, friends. Joyful, painful, uplifting tears ran down my face as the burdens I had been carrying were being handed over to Jesus. My heart softening toward mankind. My eyesight changed to where now I can see much more of the strengths in other people and far fewer of their weaknesses. I see God's purpose in my fellow believers and the potential in the unsaved. God took my heart of stone and replaced it brethren, with a heart of flesh.

As I opened myself to Jesus, I truly felt

unburdened and home, and safe and ... just lighter in every way. It was the most significant cleansing of my core that I had ever felt. All my past, every way I had been towards God and people, was washed away, I was made new again. In the days that followed this pivotal experience, I got to thinking.... who else is in the congregation was just like me? Who else was attending that church or your church or any church, and wasn't fully bonded with Christ? It was a sobering thought. If that's you, you don't have to stay in that place. God is inviting YOU to a close relationship...today! He invites you every day, and He is inviting You right now. He wants YOU to experience the joy and fulfillment of His presence. You have an open invitation; you can RSVP today, right now. You can have a personal relationship with God the Father, through the sacrifice of Jesus and by the power of the Holy Spirit. You can have a place at the table. You can partake of the feast that is prepared for you. My prayer for you is that you look seriously into your heart. It's not about being perfect or being a better person or exerting more effort. HARASSED AND HELPLESS



Matt 9:35-38 35 Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. 38 Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

"The harvest is plentiful." Now that is sure the desire of every farmer and anyone else in the growing business. If it is planted, if it is growing and if it is needed to feed or care for someone or something, then somebody had to plant, nurture, cultivate, protect, develop and wait and wait and wait and then get ready for the time of harvest. Harvest times is a very special time and a joyous time; even though it is usually a time of hard work. And depending on the crop or whatever is being harvested it is a very important time because so many lives and their well-being depend on it all happening; the plenty and the harvest. And, to be sure every planter wants a plentiful harvest, but I don't think that this is the harvest that Jesus was talking about. I think it was the "harassed and helpless" that he was talking about?

Cowboys and cowgirls, our Lord and Savior tells us in John 4:35 Do you not say, 'Four months more and then the harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. He said very plainly: "They are ripe for harvest." That was our Lord and Savior speaking of the wandering and lost, the "harassed and helpless" that were followed him around seeking the truth. The people readily understood that religion certainly did not have the answers they were seeking. The evil and corrupt Roman government was certainly not concerned or wanted to help and the people were bound by the evil that bombarded them daily. Their lives had become so unsure, troubled and they just did not know to where or who to turn to for help, guidance, strength and victory in their everyday lives.

In the first place, why were the people "like sheep without a shepherd" and why were they "harassed and helpless?" As we read and study the Old Testament and the history of God's chosen nation, the children of Israel, we sure see a pattern of moving away from the Holy God and then after a major crisis they would come running back to him in repentance and humbleness. This pattern was repeated many times down through the ages and on into New Testament times, and it is sure a history of aimless wandering, discouragement and helplessness. The people certainly resemble sheep running off without a shepherd; lost, abandoned and unable to find help. But, folks to be honest, many of us as God's children who have accepted God's Son Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord have not learned anything from those history lessons and we are just as guilty of doing the same thing. We are running around like sheep without a shepherd and especially being harassed and helpless because of the works of the devil and the massive movement of evil in this sinful world. The enemy certainly has not changed and the troubles, trials and heartaches are still here today, just as they were then. Do some of these things sound familiar, do you know someone that seems to be harassed and helpless to fight off the devil and his evil schemes? Do you know someone; family members, friends or others that appears to be "harassed and helpless" especially with so much evil running rampant across this country? What about in your own life; do you have times of feeling "harassed and helpless?" Do you think that there is a shortage of lost and hurting people today? Would Jesus look out on the multitudes around this nation and feel the same compassion and know that they were harassed and helpless?

I truly believe that Jesus would, and now my question to you, "What are you going to do about it as his servant and worker for the Kingdom of God. Do we allow the harassed and helpless people in our circle to continue on their downward spiral to everlasting hell, or do we share the truth of Jesus Christ with them? Do we leave our comfort zones and step out in faith and tell them about our Savior and Lord? Do we seek to serve in a way that touches them for good and helps them leave their lives of harassment and helplessness and especially help them find the Savior?

But first I need to ask you a question. Do you know Jesus Christ? Have you accepted him as your Savior and Lord? Do you have a personal relationship with the Lord? If not, then you are harassed and helpless, too. Please go to the section in this paper: [My Eternal Decision](#) and after you have settled this issue, then come right back. But if you have, then you have the answer to the world's problems and you have a testimony. You also have help in your walk with the Lord, too; because you have the Holy Spirit. So, now I am going to ask you another question. Have you told someone about your Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ?

You can start today by being on the lookout for those that are harassed and helpless and in need of prayer and especially in need of a Savior. Tell them you want to pray with them and for them and go ahead and pray for them. You can also give them this copy of the Christian Ranchman and get their name and address and send it to us and we will put them on the mailing list. 



they couldn't handle me or do anything with me.

Well, that only seemed to progress as I got older. I would have gotten a free ride to college playing baseball, but alcohol and drugs and women and partying was all I really seemed to want to do. Well, that kind of stuff cost money, and the demons I had is me lead me down a road of progressively worse criminal activity. I went from petty theft, all the way up to robbing banks. I robbed a bunch of banks in my life and spent 10 years in federal prison because of it. I wasn't all bad or just evil, but the demons I had inside of me were. Inside I had a good and loving heart that God had given me, and I would have never just intentionally hurt anyone, but what I was doing to get money to support my lifestyle wasn't good for sure. I had periods of time earlier in my life in which I did really well. I spent 6 years in the US military during the first Gulf war and received an honorable discharge upon separation. I completed two separate 4-year apprenticeship programs through US Department of Labor as an electrician, and in HVAC&R and I have around 100 hours of college credits and was about 10-months away from receiving a degree in electrical engineering.

After getting out of federal prison before my present incarceration I was doing very well. I married my second wife, and was making over one hundred thousand dollars a year as a gas compression mechanic. However, just as the demons of Egypt followed the people of Israel after they left their physical enslavement, my demons of alcohol and drugs followed me. Ultimately, I got so drunk that I drove on to a gas compression site that I knew had video security cameras and stole a bunch of what was basically scrap metal and didn't even remember what I had done. Well, they didn't play with me this time, they enhanced my sentence under Texas penal code law and gave me 75-years for a third-degree felony theft charge that usually carries a sentence of 2-10 years. Proverbs 3:12 says that God corrects the ones He loves. Well, I can tell you that He corrected

me pretty tough this time, but I can also tell you that I am so very thankful that He did. I know that sounds crazy.

When I came to state prison, I was broke inside but I wasn't all the way broken yet. I still was walking in the world, worshiping the many idols the world (the devil) has to offer with blinders still on my eyes. It was about after I had been in prison for 5 years that my wife and I started to have some pretty serious problems, then I got my butt in trouble and lost my contact visits with her. On top of that, I was moved to the area of the prison that houses the most violent and unruly prisoners. That's when it happened, I finally broke and hit my knees and cried out to Jesus and asked him to forgive me. I cried like a baby and confessed my sins even going all the way back to when I stole that candy bar, when I was 4-years old.

First, the best way I could explain it. I had what I've heard people call a "radical regeneration." All I wanted to do was read the Bible and talk about God and how great He is. I have seen the words come off the page in the Book of Genesis and sparkle and float in the air. Hebrews 4:12 says the Word is living and active and I can tell you that it really is. Then I started seeing the number seven (7) everywhere and it was manifesting all over in my life. I know that may sound crazy, but let me just tell you a couple things about what I mean. First, they moved me to seven building, and I had to start eating in seven chow hall. Then I get a new cell mate that has a giant number seven tattooed on his back. I have eight children between my previous wife and the one I am married to now and two of my sons were in different parts of the state and got themselves in pretty serious trouble with the law themselves. One was looking at 40-years in prison, as least that is what they were offering him, and the other was looking at 35-years in completely different jurisdiction and matters. Well, they both ended up getting 7-years after the prosecutors offered them that.

Listen to this one, as I said my dad's side of the family was Mormon, and since I have been saved by our good and gracious Lord,

my dad and I had started to mend what had been a broken relationship and I started asking him about my great grandparents. Well, he tells me that my great grandfather on my grandmother's side was a Mormon and that they threw him in jail in Utah because he had seven wives. I could tell you at least twenty more things like that and they all happened within about 3-months of me getting saved.

All I can say is that our God is a living God, and he at times was revealing himself to me in a manner that I could not ignore or write off as some type of coincidence. I even read the Bible in seven months back then for the first time all the way through.

One of the other things that happened was that it was like scales fell from my eyes and I not only knew that God was real, but that the devil and his demons were, too. Not only that, but the Holy Spirit led me down the road; as He teaches us all things, to learning and teaching spiritual warfare and that is what my gift is. I can do exhortations and preach the Word, but what I have been led to do is teach spiritual warfare. I could literally camp out in Ephesians chapter 6, verses 10-18, and talk about the battle we are in and how we protect ourselves with the armor of God. You may be thinking that's great and everything, but what are you doing to walk that out right now. Well, I can tell you that inside a prison the opportunities are limited, because we can't just go wherever we want and do whatever we want, which I am sure you already know. And the people that I believe are really hurting and broken like I was are in the medium and high custody areas of the prison, especially the young men that are using drugs in here and lost in the wilderness. So, this is what I did. I was the electrician for the whole Robertson Unit prison and that wasn't working for me because I try to minister everywhere I go, and I wasn't getting to do much of that in the areas of the prison where I could make an impact on those young men, I just told you about.

So, I found me another job shining the brass doorknobs and floor drain grates in seven building, which is where the medium custody prisoners are housed. What my job does now is allow me to minister to these men there while I am over there doing my job. It is hard sometimes and all I can really do most of the time is plant seeds and pray that God waters them. It troubles my heart that most of the young men in here are in bondage and don't want to hear about our loving Father. Nevertheless, sometimes I get to see the Holy Spirit do a work in them and they do an about face and clean up themselves and their mind, and start to have a relationship with our merciful God. Those times make any struggle all worth it. Praise God!


The Harvest is Truly Plentiful, But the Laborers are Few

I spent Thanksgiving Day 2025 with inmates at TDCJ-Hutchins Unit in Dallas, Texas, and it was the most memorable Thanksgiving in my 68 years. Although I couldn't engage with everyone present, who were eager for words of encouragement, I was reminded that God's presence is not confined by fences with razor wires. I arrived at 9AM and departed at 5PM, feeling as though I was floating. The inmates' gratitude for my presence on Thanksgiving Day, having left my family to be with them, overwhelmed my spirit.

I encourage others interested in serving within the Texas prison system to join me in mentoring inmates who desire change and need guidance to maintain a life free from incarceration. If we positively impact just one person, we've accomplished something truly remarkable. Anyone willing to join me in mentoring at Hutchins State Jail in Dallas, Texas, is welcome to come alongside me. I need your support. As a volunteer chaplain, volunteer teacher, and mentor within the

Texas prison system, I wear multiple hats. These inmates will eventually be released and reintegrate into our communities. I'm committed to providing them with a blueprint for a life free from incarceration, substance abuse, and addiction. I firmly believe that most people are good, and a significant percentage of those incarcerated have committed crimes to support a drug or alcohol habit. 


