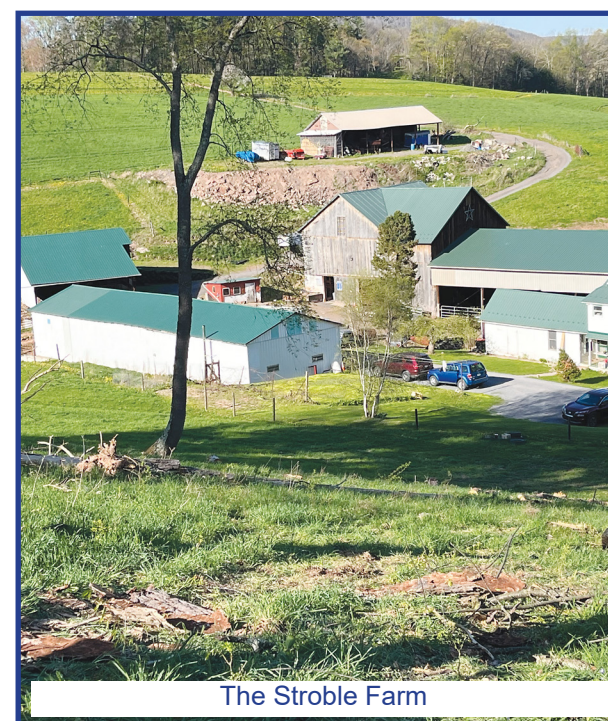

In 2007, the spirit was stirring in me and I heard “the Calling”. I put it off because I was pregnant with my third child and about to be mother again. I just didn't feel ready for what the Lord was calling me to do. I had three kids, and I worked full time. I was a co-youth leader with my husband. Lord, not now, but I will think about. My pastor at the time gave me a book called “A Christian as a Minister.” I took it looked at it and laid it

aside. I didn't read well in public it made me nervous, and I was like I cannot memorize anything; I need paper to read from it, and it was a vicious cycle. Our pastor at the time had become a minister as a second career lifestyle change. They sparked my spiritual fire which charged my heart. It was their love of Christ and their bond with him that encouraged me.

But in September of 2007, I received a phone call that night. It was from my sister-in-law in North Carolina, and I was like, hum, I wonder what she needs. Her first question was is Earl Lee there with you? I was like, no, he is at the farm. Can you get him? Why? She said, “I don't want you to be alone.” Flags going in the air for me! Why? She said, “I just don't want you to be alone. I have something I need to tell you!” I said, “Just tell me!”

She finally told me, my brother, Jim passed away. They had found him dead. (She and Jim had been separated for a while.)

The kids and his work hadn't been able to get a hold of him. He had a grand mal seizure which caused him to have a heart attack. They found him in bed in a fetal position with his face in his pillow. His dog was sitting beside him. It was heart breaking, I was enjoying a new child and planning to visit him next summer. I had just talked with him on the phone two days ago. He was 41, he was five years older than me.

I couldn't believe it. I lost my brother...I was lost for the first time in my relationship with God. I was angry, and frustrated, but I did not let that keep me from God. I struggled with the fact that I was 36, and maybe, I would die at 41. Those birthdays were dark internally for me. I don't even know if I have shared that with my husband. Pastor Dale knew I needed a distraction, and I had a good foundation in Christ. He challenged me to go take a lay speaking class. I really did not like to read in public and was not sure I had anything to say. I knew the Bible, but all those names and places to pronounce scared me. I enjoyed God's word, and I was just skeptical about if other people would understand what I was saying.

I had felt the calling, but I really wanted to teach high school kids. As time passed and I heard the calling again, but going back to school was not an option. I took the lay speaking class and stepped into my nerves, anxiety, and pressure of not wanting to fail. I did it! I knew where my heart laid. It was in ministry and sharing the Word of God. I enjoyed making new friends in classes. The scripture lessons, theology, the clown class, the church history and learning to present a sermon pulled me out of my shadows. I have been doing lay speaking ever since. Pastor Dale and Ellen became like adopted Grandparents to my kids. Pastor Dale and Ellen have helped to mentor me and Earl Lee (my husband). If we needed to talk or someone to listen, they were there. They had to move to another church as conference of the United Methodist has them do. We were heart broken, but we've stayed connected with them. The grandparent's bond and friendships has lasted along time

(Thaddeus is now 19). Although Pastor Dale passed away, he has a special place in my heart for mentoring me. It could have been a rough road without Christ. Christ is my lantern in the darkness and always at my side guiding and directing me. I just need to remember Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding in all your heart submit to him and HE will make your path straight."

My wife and I are chaplains in Missouri at Texas County Jail. I am excited to tell all of you about the joy of ministering in a jail as Cowboys For Christ Chaplains.

18 years ago I was invited by my pastor to speak to the men at our county jail. I expected to find a bunch of angry and seasoned criminals and drug addicts. Instead, I found that the audience was mostly comprised of scared boys and girls (average age about 25 years old), who desperately wanted change in their lives. A few prayed to repent and receive Jesus Christ that day and others started relationships with me that led to their salvations and discipleship training.

Today, we have three inmate led Bible studies going on daily in the jail and many salvation stories. Once a week, I go in with a team of trained ministers to evangelize and disciple the inmates. My wife goes into the Ladies' wing with a guard. They love her and give her wonderful attention as she shares her faith.

My Testimony

I was born and raised on a 100-acre farm near Emlenton, Pennsylvania. My dad was a draftsman for Joy Manufacturing Company in Franklin, Pa. My mother was a "stay at home mom" raising my brother and I. I grew up on that farm, raising cats, dogs, pigs, cows and the occasional lamb or steer for a 4H project. One thing my parents took seriously was going to church every Sunday. I wouldn't classify my parents as godly, but they taught my brother and I the importance of being part of a church body and for that I am forever grateful.

The church we attended most of my childhood was Presbyterian, so at a certain age you were expected to join the church. I think that was around the seventh or eighth grade. I can't say that I really understood salvation, but I did what I was expected to do and became a member of the church. I'm sure there were classes involved. I did have a good foundation, as far as knowing Bible stories, and knowing how to have the joy of the Lord. My pastor at the time was Darrell Knoop and he was incredible with people

and kids. He impacted my life greatly even though I don't think I really understood that I needed Jesus to be the Savior of my life and not just someone I talked about.

As I grew up, we switched churches a few times, but still I always went on Sundays, even though high school. During my high school years, I like most teenagers, was more concerned about being popular than I was about being a Christian. So, between my later high school years and the first year of college, I sought many of the pleasures that the world had to offer thinking that would bring me happiness. Instead, it magnified to me my true need for Jesus. At first, I had the fear of going to hell and that drove me back to the church, but then I realized that Jesus is a loving God and his plan was for me to serve him.

So, between my freshman and sophomore year at college, I rededicated my life and became sold out to Jesus. Shortly after this, I met Steve, my husband and started to date him. We were both serving the Lord at that point, neither of us was lukewarm, but rather working towards being on fire for God. After dating for three years, we married right after I finished college. Not long after that we

became involved in Missionettes and Royal Rangers. We attended an Assembly of God Church, and those were the programs at that time for young boys and girls. We served in that capacity for years until we were asked to leave that church to be a part of a church plant, which was closer to our house.

So, in 1994, we became part of Solid Rock Assembly of God in Grove City, PA. We were all young, including the pastor. It was a great time of growing close to the Lord in learning how to reach our community. During this time, Steve began to lead Bible studies and take correspondence courses. I was on the worship team often ministering on Sunday mornings, Sunday nights and Wednesday nights. When we had our three children, I stepped back to take care of them, but still headed up the women's ministry at our church. I organized monthly meetings throughout the year for our women to get together and fellowship.

As our children became older, I began to teach Missionettes again. Then in 2005, I began to take our children to the AWANA program at then Alliance Church in our community. After a year, we felt called to go to that church. While there, Steve and I were part of the children's ministry team every Sunday for the next 14 years. Steve was busy working full-

time and I was busy homeschooling the kids. We still ministered every Sunday mornings, but in addition I ministered in AWANA and in the other groups that my children were active in. I was also the leader of Mercer County Christian Homeschoolers for two years.

As my kids grew, I thought of the calling to become more connected with the unsaved community. I was already a fitness instructor, and so I pursued several certifications, so that I could teach more classes. It could become a job, and it would also be a ministry. Once my kids had completed homeschooling, I began to teach more classes and currently I teach over 20 classes a week. It has been a great opportunity for me to build relationships in my community. I cannot walk in any store without seeing people that know me and want to talk to me.

In the year 2020, we felt called to Transformation Church, which is an Assembly of God Church in our town. Many of these people had been part of our church, the Solid Rock back in the 90's. We still currently attend there, I am on the worship team, and Steve and I are ministering together to children nearly every week. Not only is Steve my partner in marriage, but he is my partner in ministry. These last few years, as he has ministered as a Chaplain, I am often times alongside of him. The only times I'm not, are the Sundays I am on the worship team. I know that becoming a Chaplain with Cowboys For Christ will help me become even closer to the Lord and help me to win souls for him.

Now fast forward 12 years and I get out of prison, my first time, with mindset of an 18-year-old. I do good for the first four months, but after having one door after another slammed shut in my face, I fell into a dark hole. I got onto farmer only.com, found the wrong woman, a year after meeting her, we got married. Now, three years later, I caught her with another man, for the second time. I went off. And robbed a gas station, while on parole. Went back to county jail and was sentenced to 50 years.

Now my first unit in TDCJ was Allred, where I met a man named, Jeremiah Sexton. Now Jeremiah is a God-fearing man, who helped me find my way back to God. He and I were cellies for 5 ½ years, before being shipped to Bill Clements Unit. I just wanted you to know that the love that Jeremiah showed me by helping me find God again has changed my life. Is there any way I can start getting your newspaper, please, if it is free. I’m an indigent inmate, who has a 73-year-old daddy that is fighting cancer, right now. I don’t have money, if it costs. from Sonia Solis

My name is Sonia Solis and I’m 41 years old, and I was born in Twin Falls, Idaho. I am being housed here at the Pocatello Women’s Prison, where I have received the Christian Ranchman newsletter, and I’m sure not willing to let it go. Since the age of 12, I have suffered with addiction of methamphetamine, that has left me blinded, not knowing the needs of my children. I am not blinded by God’s Word, but I have rebelled, been bitter, gave up, stopped praying and went into shamanism, witchcraft, read on satanism and struggled with wicca. I was intrigued by these and have noticed them to be more vivid than Christ. I can sense sometimes the marching and that was earlier today, when I want to dedication and gave my life back to Christ.

I sensed a spiritual warfare and I just don’t

want to waver in my faith in Christ, no more. I want to know and believe that Jehovah does have a plan and a new way of living. Please pray for me, that I stop being intrigued by wicca and methamphetamine. Not only that, but there’s a lot of women that are into the wicca and satanism and lesbian activity, and are content and don’t want to change. I know that as a follower of Christ, we cannot be lukewarm, neither should we waver in our faith, and this gives the enemy entry to fiddle with me and my children’s lives. This November 2025, my son blessed our family with my own first granddaughter, so I am a first made grandmother. I do not want this lifestyle to continue, neither for me nor my family. My son, not sure if he’s on a rider, but he is incarcerated in Boise, Idaho. There is a lot of spiritual warfare, but I believe nothing is impossible for Jesus Christ.

Please keep me and the families: Solis, Martinez and Mendez in your prayers for we all suffer from neglect, abandonment, addiction, violence, gangs, to sum it up, endangerment. Some of us put ourselves in that position, but other in the family, such as, our children do not need to suffer this ongoing curse. 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Riding Point With Dave Harvey...

ALL SCRIPTURE



2 Tim 3:16-17 16 All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. All Scripture is inspired by God or as many translations have it "all Scripture is God breathed" or "all scripture is given by inspiration of God" which is certainly very clear and to the point. When you pick up a copy of the Holy Bible, remember "all Scripture" there is no "except for this translation or that translation" it very clearly says, "all Scripture." Because at the time the Apostle Paul penned the Words in these verses given by the Holy Spirit, he wrote them in the Greek language, and "all Scripture has been translated by the Holy Spirit as he guided servants to render them into the languages of today" whatever they may be. And it is so important to know this fact and be firmly committed to the truth of the Word of God when working with the unknowing, the unlearned or "babies of this world" seeking the Lord. They have no idea of different translations or versions, but they know they are lost and they are feeling the gentle drawing of the Holy Spirit and they are seeking the Savior. They want to know the truth and they want to understand this truth, believe this truth and live by this truth and accept this wonderful eternal life-giving truth.

God's Holy Word tells us that we are called to be empowered by the Holy Spirit and to be his witness in: "Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you. You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the uttermost parts of the earth." We are to declare this truth and I love how the Easy Read Version has it stated in: "Rom 10:14 But before people can pray to the Lord for help, they must believe in him. And before they can believe in the Lord, they must hear about him. And for anyone to hear about the Lord, someone must tell them." And we must share this wonderful truth in a way they can understand, receive and act upon this eternal life changing good news of Jeus Christ.

As we study the Greek words in this Scripture, we must look at the word used for "man" which is anthropos (anth'-ro-pos) and it carries the meaning of man-faced, or a human being. So, cowgirls you are not excluded from this declaration that we; as GOD'S children are to be "complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." We, as human beings, are a special creation from Almighty God, created in his own image. "Gen 1:27 God created man in his own image. In God's image he created him; male and female he created them." Maybe they need a Bible they can understand; like our Cowboys For Christ ERV (Easy Read Version) or just maybe they need someone to pray with them and explain the Holy Father's love, and his Son, the Lamb of God and the perfect plan of eternal salvation that is free to anyone and everyone that would repent of their sins and accept him as their Savior and Lord. Just maybe! Share Jesus Christ with someone today, you will be glad you did. God bless you as you share His love, in Jesus' Name, Amen.

Dear Cowboys For Christ, hello, Cowboys For Christ Chaplains and volunteers (men & women) all across America. I just want to start off by saying, "God bless each and every one of y'all for what y'all are doing inside and outside of the prison systems across the states of the US." My name is Jonathan Swindell aka "Bear" and I have been incarcerated since 2019 (this time) and I am by the love, grace and mercy from God, going home February 3, 2026. During my incarceration I have had the normal ups & downs and every day battles one would have in prison; drinking, drugs, fighting and causing the bosses as much trouble as I could. Within a year of my 20-year sentence and my actual release date being 2040, I decided that I didn't want to spend any longer than I had to in prison and I got tired and fed up in the way I was living and doing my time.

So, I got me a Bible and dove head first into the Word of God. It took 2 years on a waiting list, but I never gave up and I was moved down to the Faith Based Dorm where I could be around like-minded brothers. This is where I met my good friend and brother in Christ, Don Barthold. Whom I'm sure you know, for he is a Cowboys For Christ Chaplain, who comes to visit us here at the Hutchins Unit. Now, mind you, I've been doing time since I was 18 and I am covered in tattoos from head to toe, and I just knew that Mr. Barthold was gonna avoid me at all cost, but he did just the opposite! He came right to me and we hit it off, right off the bat. I may not look it, but my daddy raised me up with an old spirit and I am 100% to the core, a country boy and was so excited when I learned about Cowboys For Christ.

As my faith and hunger for Jesus grew stronger day by day, the next time Don came back to my unit, I asked him how I could get more involved in the Cowboys For Christ ministry. And he gave some resources to get some Bible studies and info on how I could become a possible Cowboys For Christ Chaplain myself, upon my release (which I still want to do.) Here I am 6+ years later and still growing strong for the Lord and hunger and thirst for more. As I mentioned earlier, I go home February 3, 2026 and will no longer receive the Christian Ranchman. I would love it, if you could forward it to where I am paroling to, because I enjoy

reading it so much. Once I'm home and settled in, I fully plan on contacting Mr. Barthold and coming back into the prison system with him to mentor to the men in prison.

I thank y'all so much and my hat goes off to y'all. Keep up the God given blessings that y'all pour into us and I look forward to hopefully joining up with you guys soon. God bless, from your brother in Christ, Bear

Every year I float my wife's horses for her. Every year I come to Lady and bypass her. She is the hardest horse I float all year. We butt heads, I try to tell her what to do and she beats me up. So, it's been a while since I worked on her. Every year we think is her last. I was dead tired, my joints ache, but as we progressed through the herd, I let out a sigh, "bring me that old brown mare".

10 years ago, my wife came from Western Pa when we got married. She unloaded 2

chestnut quarter horse mares. Now anybody that knows horses realize it's not the stud that is in charge of the herd....its the lead mare. Lady was that mare. 9 horses followed her every move. When she went to the back field they followed. When they came up to eat in the

barn, she led. She was first; in charge. Years and years have shown wear on this old girl. Every year we decide whether it's her time to pass on. Every year she just hangs on. She follows now. Her knees; arthritic, like mine. She walks a slow-walk, she follows the younger mare that has taken over the herd.

"Bring me that old brown mare" I repeated. Usually, we have to get medicine from the vet to calm her down. Not this year. I grabbed her and said "lady, I want to help you." For the first time she stood still. Maybe she realized I really meant her good. Her teeth were a mess I'm sorry to say. I worked hard; both our bones creaked in the stillness of that old barn.

My wife came around to witness this historic event. My wife's eyes lit up, "Oh lady, what a good girl." My wife stood there, one hand on her hip, the other holding a cup of coffee. She tilted that coffee as if to point to her. "I love that horse" she said. She taught all my children how to ride. Her knees are so big because my oldest son 25 years ago had her in a cross-country race. He took her over jumps that were way to high. She raced against the most expensive horses in western Pa. She never quit, she tried, she jumped, she gave all she had. She really goes back to the old foundation quarter horses. On her registration papers instead of a name, it says "brown mare".

I worked and worked. I knew she felt better. Gone were the years of sharp edges and pain. I was ashamed. The horse never complained, never showed signs of discomfort. When we were done all the horses, I stopped to witness the most beautiful sight. Out through the field the herd ran to their hay that was lined up along the drive. Leading the herd was this crickety old horse. Her head was held high, as she turned back to look at me in thanks.

The Bible says "even when we cannot speak, the Holy Spirit takes that prayer to the Father".

I heard her needs and for a moment I stood tall too, thinking of younger days. The joy for me in all these years is in the giving, not the taking.

I thought back to this horse. Her joy had been missing because she couldn't give in the way she wanted.....her joy was in the giving...being part of the herd...being needed....

When I went out this morning, there was a beautiful sight. Leading the herd..

The old brown mare...Thank you Lord....

I can grow cucumbers, tomatoes, and pumpkins, and lettuce. Yes, I can kill the good things like produce, but I will not take all the credit – I have help! Family members with weed whackers!! As a farmer's wife, my mother-in-law taught me many things and how to improve on the things I did know such as canning and preserving. She taught me to be strong and faithful servant to God and my church.
